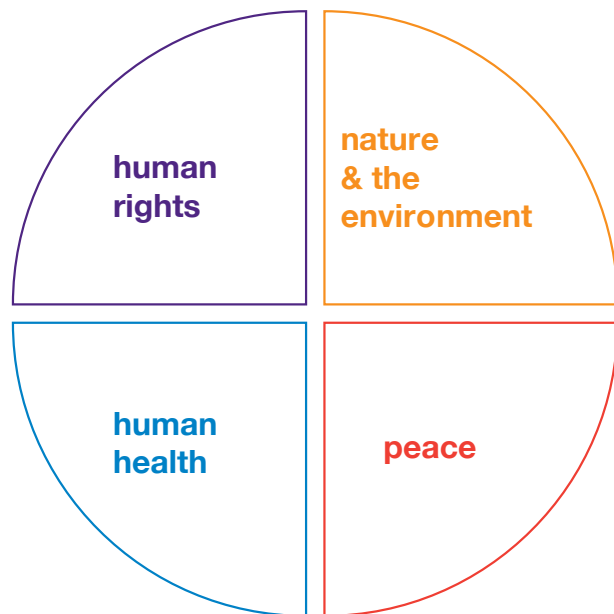
For three days this October, young people in Toronto will gather in Downsview Park to learn how they can take action on the United Nations Millennium Development Goals.

We invite you to show them the way.

Global Development Villages have been organized around the world since 1991, from South Korea to Chile and, this summer, in the United Kingdom for 35,000 young people!

The Canadian Global Development Village will take place once this Fall and once next Spring. We encourage you to join us to teach Canadian youth aged 12-17 practical steps and simple techniques for maintaining a healthy population, an equitable society and a clean environment now and in the future.

The Village will be divided into four theme areas:



As an organization you can display information at the GDV on a topic pertaining to one of the themes. You can also submit a proposal to host an interactive/hands-on workshop or presentation.

Both your display and your workshop should be designed to give youth a better understanding of the Millenium Development Goals, and provide them with ideas for action that they can apply in their own lives and communities.

The intention of the GDV is to enable young people to become “citizens of the world”. Your display and workshop should help them identify with the greater issues that unite all of humankind, recognize the origins and consequences of these issues, and acquire the skills to react in a meaningful way.

For many youth, the GDV will be their first step in obtaining the Youth of the World Award, a part of which includes 75 hours of volunteer service. As such, please be prepared to talk about volunteer opportunities within your organization.

We will cover the cost of supplies and materials for the workshops and presentations. If you would like to host a workshop but require assistance brainstorming or developing an idea, please contact us to discuss activities that have run successfully at other GDVs.
